SMES AND THE JUST TRANSITION

One of the truisms in life is that the only constant is change. Anyone in business in Taranaki will be well aware of the growing and ever-changing demands being placed on business in this region.

A 2018 OECD issues paper talks about eco-innovation and eco-adoption for the SME sector. "The key constraints for SMEs are the high cost of green innovation, the ability to fund learning and change processes and the tradeoff between 'greening' and business performance."

Velocite is at the leadership table to advocate for SMEs and will continue to ask the question, "How do we (NZ collectively) enable existing business owners to become eco-innovators and eco-adopters?" Answer, so SMEs can continue to create new jobs for Taranaki and New Zealand.
